

Little League, Pee Wee Teams Set For Season's Play Starting This Week

"Baseball for Kids" season is set to start this week and will continue through July, according to Dick Wilson, member of the local committee. Competing will be nine teams including close to 200 boys ranging in ages from 7 to 19.

Wilson said a schedule will appear later this week, listing all home games of all teams. Little league and Pee Wee action will take place at south city park where new dugouts and a new backstop will be put to use.

New bleachers have also been installed at both city parks. These were contributed by the Lions club, Eagles lodge and Jaycees and were constructed by crews from the Lions and the Grain Millers union.

Wilson drew attention to the Pony league team which plays no regular schedule but manages to compete in 10 to 15 home games each summer on their diamond at north city park.

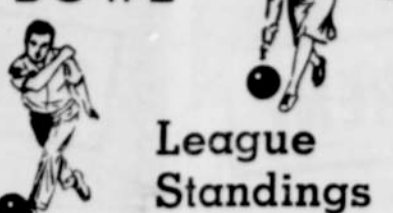
Services were held Wednesday, May 21, at Lindquist chapel in Ogden.
