S. Martinez Takes Intensive Training With Marine Group

Marine Lance Corporal Salvador Martinez, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jess Martinez, route 1, Nyssa, is undergoing lock-on training with the First battalion of the Seventh Marine Regiment at Camp Pendleton, Calif.

Lock-on is the name given to six weeks of intensive training that progresses from basic tactics of the fire team and squad to complex maneuvers of the company and battalion.

The training is conducted periodically to maintain the battalion's combat-ready status. New personnel in the battalion receive indoctrination in scouting and patrolling, counter-guerrilla warfare and helicopter assault techniques. The Marines also familiarize themselves with flame throwers, mortars and 3.5-inch rockets.

The training increases the battalion's preparedness which is vital to the Marine corps in fulfilling its role as the nation's force-in-readiness.
