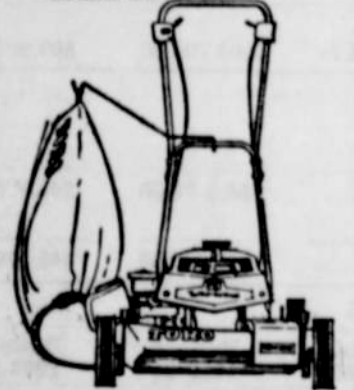
To Begin Nurse's Training
