"Your government said to wait, but for how long? We go to Washington and they say they want an uprising inside of Cuba. How can they have an uprising if we aren't allowed to help them?

"The underground in Cuba is bigger than ever but they have no arms to fight with. We can't sit here in America waiting for Uncle Sam-we have been waiting for three years. It is our duty to do something. It is a very small thing, but at least it is something.
