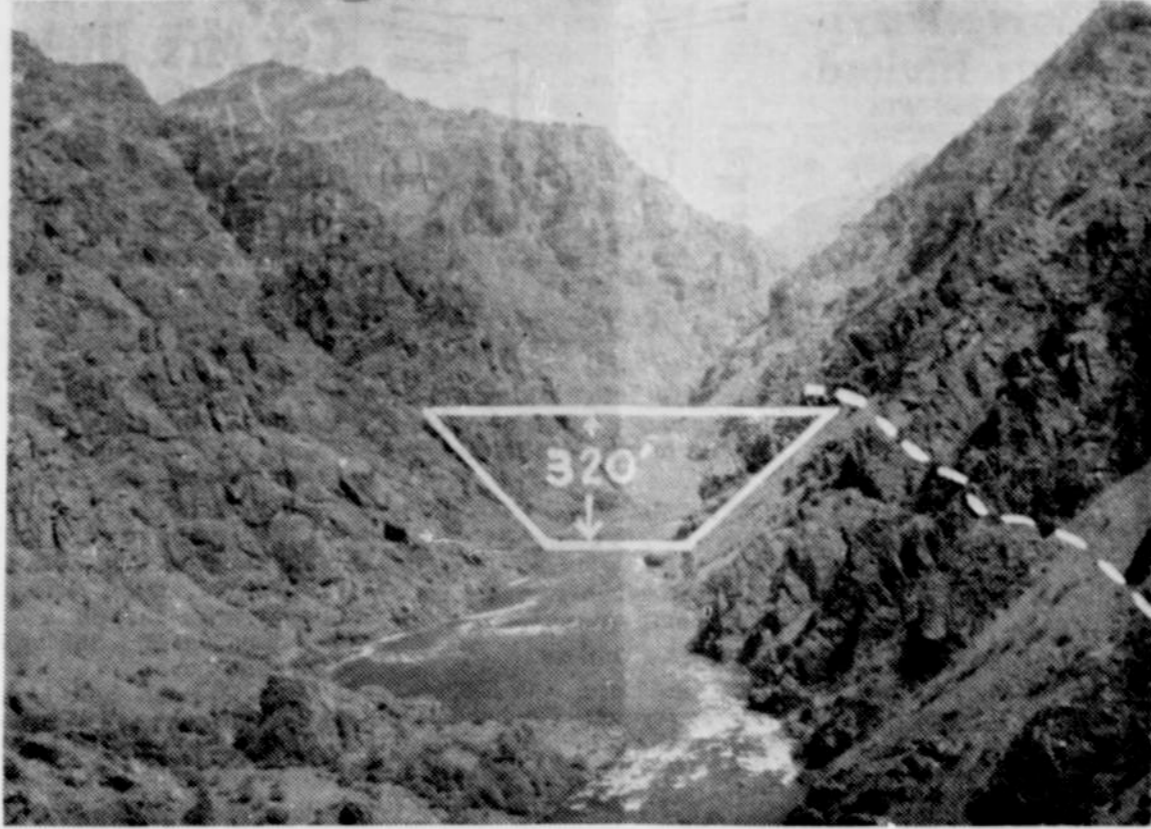

### Men. Machines Transform Hells Canyon



THRUSTING FORWARD with chattering drill rigs and booming blasts, workmen have started construction of the third and final section of a 23-mile access highway reaching along steep mountain slopes to the site of Idaho Power company's Hells Canyon dam. Broken white line at right in this view looking downstream in the mile-deep gorge shows where two-lane route will be cut in solid rock to reach dam site. Location of giant concrete Hells Canyon dam and its 425,000-kilowatt powerhouse, which Idaho Power will build at a cost of nearly \$70 million, is indicated by solid white line. Dam will be a

gravity structure rising some 320 feet—about 120 feet taller than Idaho's state capitol building. Construction of final two-mile section of the highway, called the toughest project of its type ever undertaken, will be performed by Morrison-Knudsen, Inc., Boise, under a contract awarded on its low bid of more than \$539,000 in competitive bidding. The contract boosted to about \$3.5 million the total cost of the new route which will be opened later for public access to the scenic area and for full development of known deposits of low-grade ore.
