Snake River Islands Subject to Federal, State Hunting Rules

Over 30 Snake river islands between Nyssa and Farewell Bend have recently been transferred to the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. These islands, now a part of the Deer Flat National Wildlife Refuge, are currently being posted with the standard wildlife refuge emblem.

Refuge Manager G. H. Crawford has announced that these islands will remain open to upland game, migratory waterfowl and deer hunting during the regular seasons and subject to state and federal hunting regulations.

Fishing, also subject to state and federal regulations, will also be permitted on these islands.

Crawford further stated that "any other use of the islands is strictly regulated and subject to approval of our office." Inquiries regarding these islands should be addressed to G. H. Crawford, Deer Flat National Wildlife Refuge, Route 1, Nampa, Idaho.

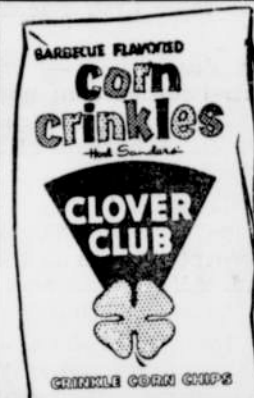
