

OSU Machine Development to Assist World's Seed Testing Laboratories

Machines designed to speed up seed analysis are being developed by Oregon State university researchers in a move which may bring partial mechanization to the world's seed testing laboratories.

Seed testing operations have changed little in the past 50 years, with all purity analysis work being done by hand. Experimental models of four machines developed at OSU may bring about some of the first changes.
