Jan Kruijt of San Francisco, a nephew of Mrs. Alida Smit, was a Monday overnight guest in her home.

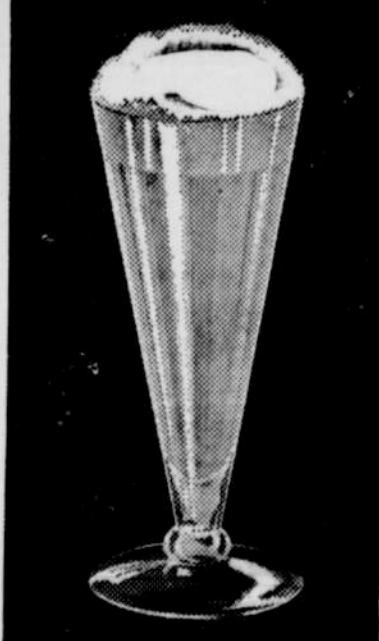
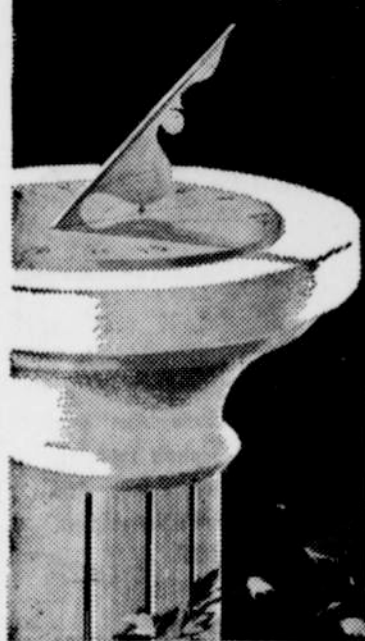
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PTA of Apple Valley Holds Mothers' Tea, Teachers' Reception
