Production Record Of Local Gow Given; Calf Shows Fast Gain

Newell Heights — Mr. and Mrs. Charles Leedy of this community have reported that they have a bull calf named Ferdinand which made the news last week on radio.

Mrs. Wilson Witt, area correspondent, called Farmers Feed and Seed company office and secured the following information, of which only a part was given over the air.

The calf's sire is Green Notch Segis Ginger, while the dam is Maebaer Susan Homestead Armsby. The dam's last record for a 305-day period is 19,646 pounds of milk and 790 pounds of butterfat.

The cow did not quit milking after the 305 days, but continued to produce for 429 days, a total of 23,804 pounds of milk and 944.3 pounds of butterfat.

Ferdinand was born June 17 and weighed 122 pounds. At the end of the second month he weighed 206 pounds, a gain of 84 pounds. He is being fed Purina Calf Startena and the local feed company and calf owners report they are hoping to have a 400-pound calf at the end of a four-month period.

Leedy plans to keep the animal to be used for breeding purposes.

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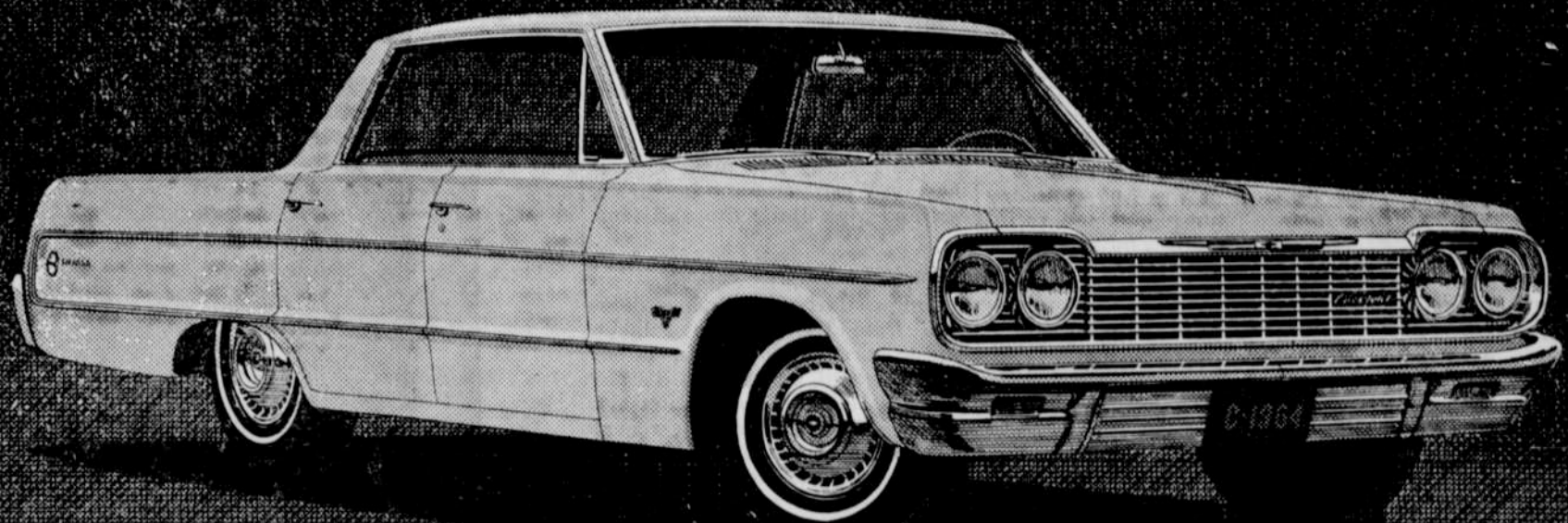
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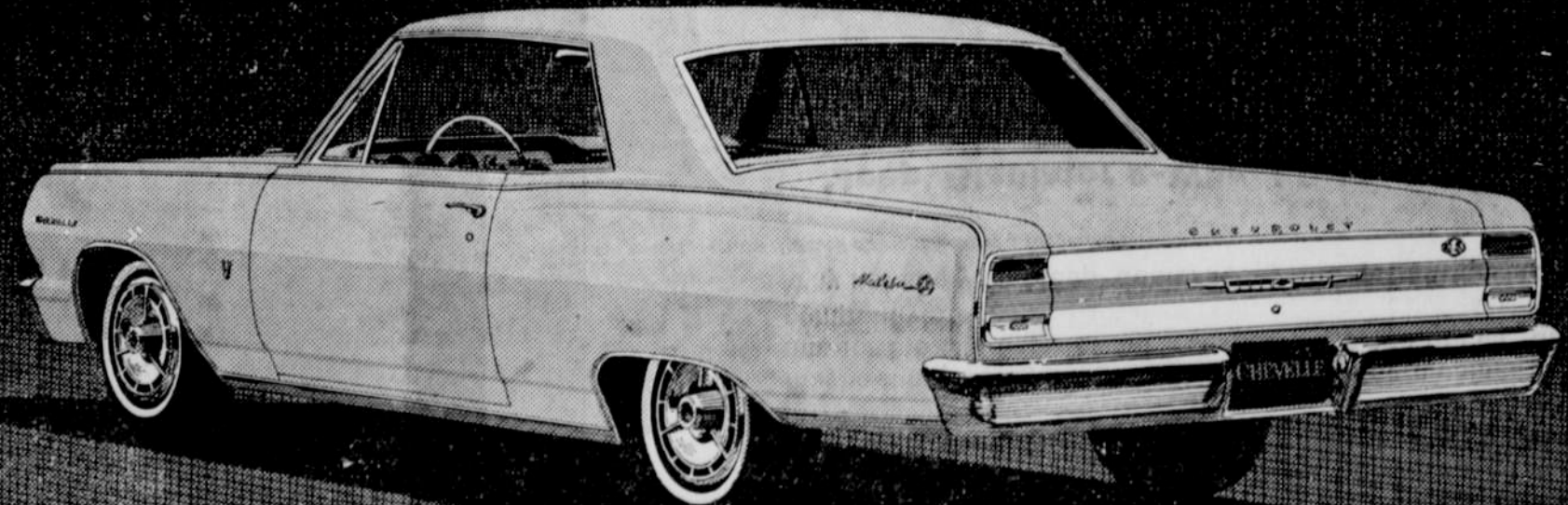
