## Flora Swigert Rites Conducted Tuesday At Caldwell Chapel

Funeral services for Mrs. Flora Swigert of Wilder were conducted Tuesday afternoon, Oct. 8, 1963, at Peckham-Dakan-Davis chapel in Caldwell. The Rev. A. E. Gilbert was officiating minister. Interment was at Roswell cemetery.

Mrs. Swigert, a longtime resident of Canyon county, Idaho, succumbed Saturday morning in a Caldwell nursing home.

She was born Nov. 27, 1876, in Richardson county, Neb., and on Oct. 24, 1894, was united in marriage to George W. Swigert in Fall City, Neb.

Soon after their marriage they moved to western Nebraska where they resided until 1910, at which time they moved to Roswell. In 1919 they homesteaded in the Arena Valley area. Mr. Swigert died Oct. 31, 1948, and in 1949 Mrs. Swigert moved to Wilder.

The deceased was a member of the Wilder Methodist church, Woman's Society of Christian Service and the Fargo Community Ladies' club.

Survivors include four sons, Wilford and Dallas, both of Wilder; Foster of Medford, Ore., and Otis of Big Bend. Also surviving are four daughters, Mrs. Edythe Prosser of Big Bend, Mrs. Ed Maurer of Wilder, Mrs. Ray Hawk of Boise and Mrs. Vera Pollard of Nampa.

Other survivors include a sister, Mrs. Joseph Harper of Caldwell, 19 grandchildren and 38 great-grandchildren.


