Last Friday evening in the high school cafeteria, junior high school boys who had earned their numerals in football were honored at a banquet given by the student body, coaching staff and parents of the boys.

Coach Dan Martin, master of ceremonies, introduced the guests of honor including the junior high faculty, high school coaching staff and administrators.

James Skeen then introduced the boys who had participated in football, and each in turn, introduced his parents.

Mel Calhoun, junior varsity football and varsity wrestling coach was main speaker of the evening. He stressed the importance of the young men in keeping up their interest in athletics when entering high school.

He pointed out that one of the factors responsible for Nyssa's rather mediocre football record is due to the fact that so many of the fellows fail to turn out during their freshman and sophomore years.

The coach stated that one salient argument presented in favor of participation in a football program, to parents who are afraid their boy might get hurt, is the fact that far more high school youths are injured in car accidents after school hours than are hurt on the playing field. He then quoted statistics from the National Safety Council to substantiate that fact.

A girls' glee club, under direction of Gary Clawson, sang two numbers, and the cheer leaders, decked out in football regalia, presented a clever skit.

With excellent food, entertainment and inspiring talks, the boys report a most enjoyable evening but all agreed that the most pleasant part was the introduction of their parents.

Members of the present teams are asked to keep in mind that they are creating history. Some, one, 10 or 20 years from now, may be looking over the records and may find that what the teams did in 1963-64 was worthy of some mention as an inspiration to players, as yet not in circulation.

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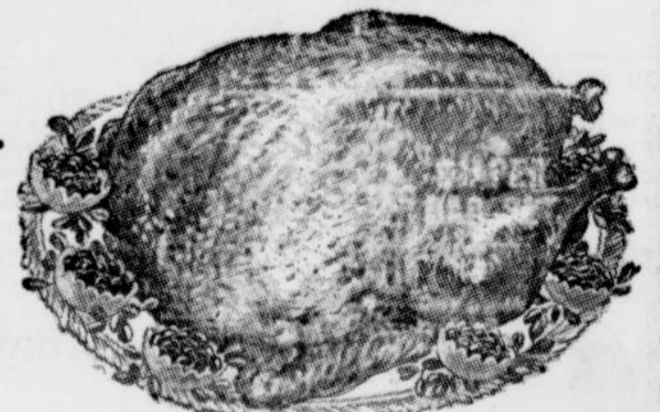


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
