

Nyssa Bulldogs Lose to Parma 60-40; Burns Wins Saturday Game 44 to 41

John Moore poured in 18 points and was matched by Terry Olt with 18 more. Olt also did exceptional work on the defensive backboard. Ralph Leavitt accounted for 12 counters while Gene Brown was credited with eight.

State Commission Cleans, Restocks Fishing Streams

Oregon State Game commission completed rehabilitation work for the removal of trash fish on the following waters during the past year: 18 miles of the south fork of Malheur river from Riverside to the county bridge, 56 miles of the Malheur from Warm Springs dam to the Southside Harper diversion, 16 miles of the north fork from Beulah dam to Juntura, 78 miles of Bully creek and tributaries and Bully creek reservoir.

Restocking to date includes 72,000 rainbow in Bully creek reservoir, 22,000 rainbow in Malheur river from Riverside to the Southside Harper diversion and 4,000 rainbow in the south fork from Riverside to the county bridge. These trout averaged 4.5 inches when stocked and should be legal size near the opening of fishing season April 25.



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
