Aliens Must Register Annually in January

District Director Alfred J. Urbano of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at Portland stated last week that the annual alien address report program usually causes a sharp rise in the number of applications for naturalization.

The law requires all aliens in the United States, with few exceptions, to report their addresses each January. Throughout the U. S. almost 30 percent more applications for naturalization are received during the months of January, February and March than are received during other months. Urbano attributes this sudden rise to the Alien Address Report program.

Aliens not required to make this report are diplomats, those accredited to certain international organizations and those who have entered temporarily as agricultural laborers.

Forms for making the reports will be available to aliens at all post offices and offices of the Immigration and Naturalization Service during January. Urbano indicated that aliens desiring information concerning naturalization or similar matters should obtain the forms at an office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service where personnel trained in these fields will be available to answer inquiries.
