Basque History Told To Extension Group At Holiday Meeting

Newell Heights — AKH Home Extension unit met Dec. 19 at the home of Dorothy Fox with 16 members and one guest, Karla Krieh, in attendance.

A potluck turkey dinner was served together with a number of Basque dishes and was followed by a business session.

Lesson was "The Basque People and Their Customs," presented by Mrs. Fox and Erma Sparks. Interesting statistics included the fact that the Basque provinces lie in the Pyrenees mountains, some on the Spanish side and others in the French district. Language of the people, however, is neither Spanish nor French.

The Basque people first came to Oregon in 1897 and there is now a large settlement in the Boise valley, another in California and they are 99 percent Catholic.

In the Basque country, school convenes 12 months a year, six days a week and all instructors are Spanish. Boys and girls are taught separately in both schools and churches.

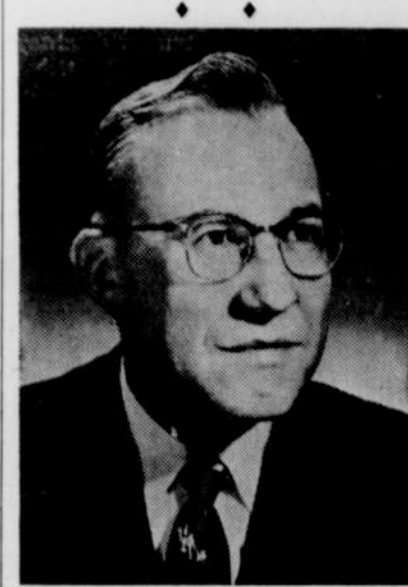
seven states. Livestock grazes the year around on the mountains. Fishing is popular and the people mine for iron ore. Chief sport is weight lifting.

The country is still under Spanish rule. The Basque people are descendants of three brothers in the Pyrenees mountains, each going a different direction to establish his home.

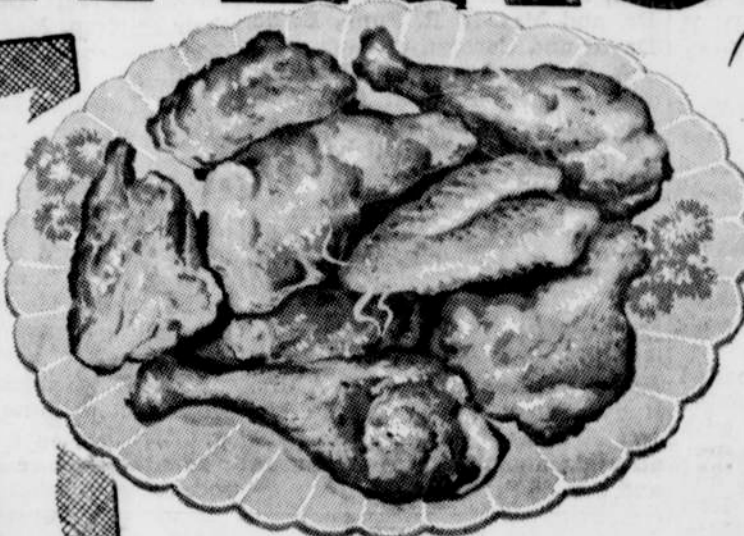

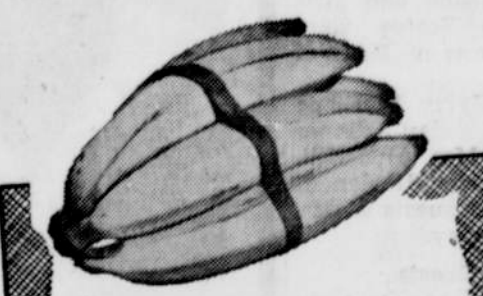

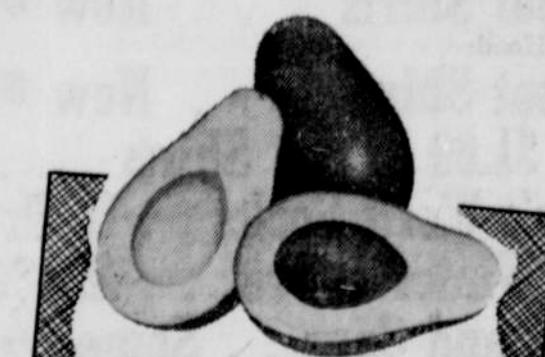


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
