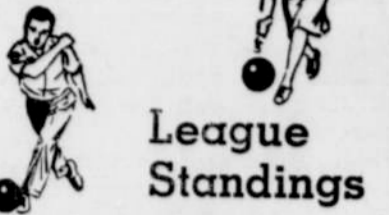

RETURNS TO PROVO

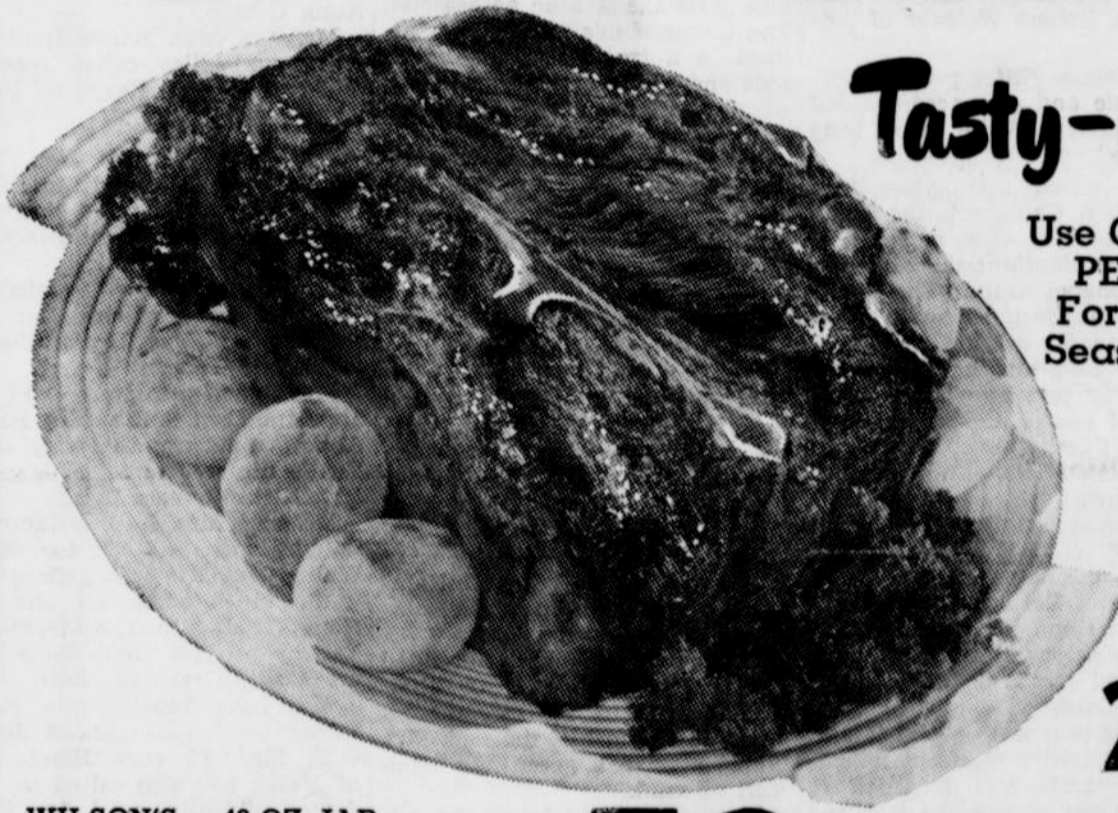
