

### Malheur 4-H Delegates Plan to Attend State Government Training Session

More than 70 Oregon 4-H boys and girls will gain first-hand knowledge of their state government during the eighth annual Oregon 4-H club conference slated Feb. 16-18 in Salem.

Representing Malheur county will be Kay Pobanz and Michael Rudd. Meeting and talking to state officials provides a unique opportunity for these young men and women to learn about their government, its functions and its responsibilities, points out Burton S. Hutton of Oregon State university, state 4-H club leader.

Built around the theme, "Know Your State Government," the conference will offer 4-H delegates ample time to ask questions, Hutton explained.

**Sessions Held in Capitol**  
The state capitol building will be the setting for many of the sessions.

Secretary of State Howell Appleby, Jr., will welcome delegates to the conference when they assemble in the House of Representatives. Members of the House and Senate will discuss the legislative branch of government.

Delegates will meet with Gov. Mark O. Hatfield for a discussion of the executive branch of state government. The role of the judiciary will be outlined by Chief Justice William McAllister.

How state government is financed will be explained by Howard Belton, state treasurer. Sam Haley, legislative counsel, will tell how legislation is developed.

**To Study Varied Phases**  
Delegates will learn about the work of the Oregon State Police and state departments of employment, elections and forestry in special group meetings. Arrangements for these are being made by Capt. Byron Hazelton, state police; David Cameron, commissioner of employment; Lee Harter and Ralph Voris, state forestry department; Jack Thompson, elections supervisor.

Former Gov. Robert Holmes of Portland will address delegates at the Feb. 16 orientation dinner. Warne Nunn, executive assistant to the governor, will speak at the annual banquet Feb. 17.

Four delegates, 17 years of age or older, will be chosen in interviews to represent Oregon at the 1964 National 4-H club conference in Washington, D.C., later this year.

**Program Grows in Counties**  
Many of the delegates at Salem will have had similar experiences on the local level where they received a first-hand look at county government, Hutton pointed out. This program has grown each year as more counties realize the importance of acquainting young people with all levels of government.

The program for the state conference was developed with the governor's office. Sears-Roebuck Foundation provides meals and lodging for all conference delegates.

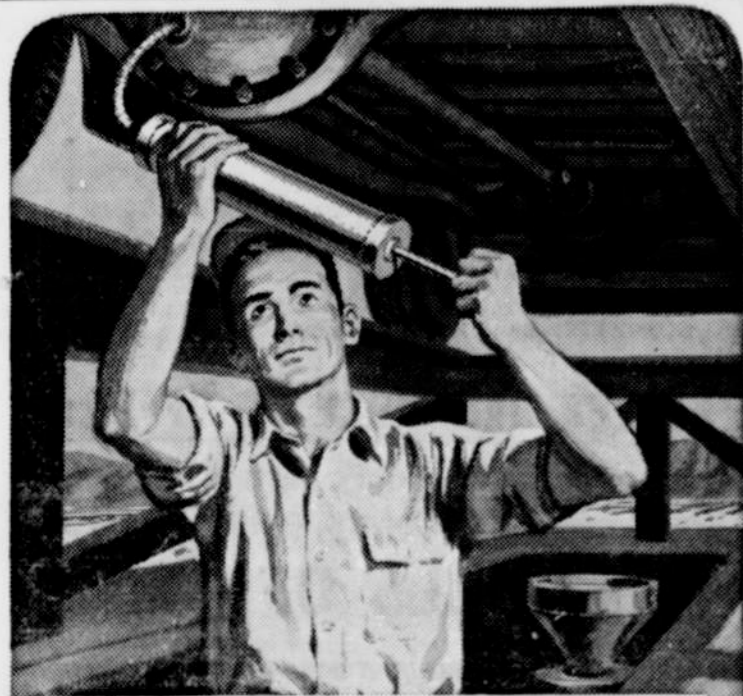
