ORDER In the County Court Of the State of Oregon For the County of Malheur In the Matter of the Formation of the ADRIAN RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, on the 5th day of February, 1964, this Court made and entered an Order declaring its intention of calling an election for or against the organization of a rural fire protection district to be known as the Adrian Rural Fire Protection District, comprising the territory within the following described boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning on the Range line between Ranges 44 and 45 E.W.M., at the Section corner common to Sections 19, 24, 25 and 30, Township 20; thence east along section line to the NE corner of the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Sec. 29, Twp. 20, R. 46; thence south to the SW corner of the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Sec. 29, Twp. 20, R. 46; thence east along half section line to the SE corner of the NE 1/4 of Sec. 29, Twp. 20, R. 46; thence north to Section corner common to Secs. 20, 21, 29 and 28, Twp. 20, R. 46; thence east to the section corner common to Secs. 23, 24, 26 and 25, Twp. 20, R. 46; thence south to the section corner common to Secs. 26, 25, 35 and 36, Twp. 20, R. 46; thence continue in a northeasterly direction along the Owyhee River and across the Snake River to the Idaho-Oregon State boundary line, Twp. 20, R. 47; thence south along said boundary line to the Township line between Twps. 24 and 25, R. 47; thence west along said Township line to the Range line between R. 45 and R. 46; thence north along said Range line to the Township line between Twps. 23 and 24; thence west along said Township line to the point of intersection with the Owyhee Reservoir and River in Sec. 33, R. 44; thence in a northeasterly direction along the southern side of the Owyhee Reservoir and River to the point where the River crosses the section line between Secs. 27 and 22, Twp. 21, R. 45; thence west along section line to the Range line between Ranges 44 and 45, Twp. 21; thence north along said Range line to the point of beginning, which foregoing description also describes the boundaries of School District No. 61, Malheur County, Oregon;

All being within Malheur County, Oregon, and for the election of five (5) Directors to serve said district, and,

WHEREAS, in said Order, 1:30 o'clock p.m., the 18th day of March, 1964, was set for the time of hearing of said election to be held within said district; now,

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that a special election be held on the 20th day of April, 1964, at the Adrian Grade School, Adrian, Oregon, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the County Clerk shall appoint the judges and clerks of election, post notices thereof for four (4) successive weeks prior to the election in each of three public places within the proposed district, publish in Nyssa Gate City Journal once a week for four (4) successive weeks, and prepare the ballot to be used at such election.
