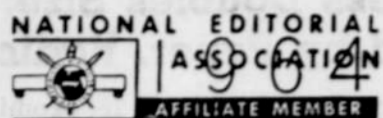

Saturday Convention Scheduled by Youth Of Lutheran Church

The Blue Mountain conference Luther league convention will be held Saturday, April 18, at Faith Lutheran church, according to Pastor John Milbrath. This conference comprises the area from Walla Walla, Wash., to American Falls, Idaho, a distance of 550 miles and has 11 churches in all.

Program theme for the convention will be "My Life of Worship." The young people will come to Nyssa by auto and train and since some of the group will be traveling by rail, they will conduct their part of the convention enroute. Those attending from La Grande, Baker, Nyssa, Vale, American Falls and Twin Falls will meet at 4:30 Saturday afternoon for the same basic program as that conducted on the train.

The two groups will meet at the railway station at 7:30 Saturday evening and then go to Faith Lutheran church where a banquet will be served and a program for the evening will be presented. It is anticipated that approximately 75 leaguers will be present at the banquet with 40 coming by train.

The visitors will stay overnight in homes of members of Faith Lutheran church and depart at 7:30 Sunday morning.
