Mrs. Roy Wild has returned home after undergoing recent major surgery in the Samaritan Community hospital at Nampa.

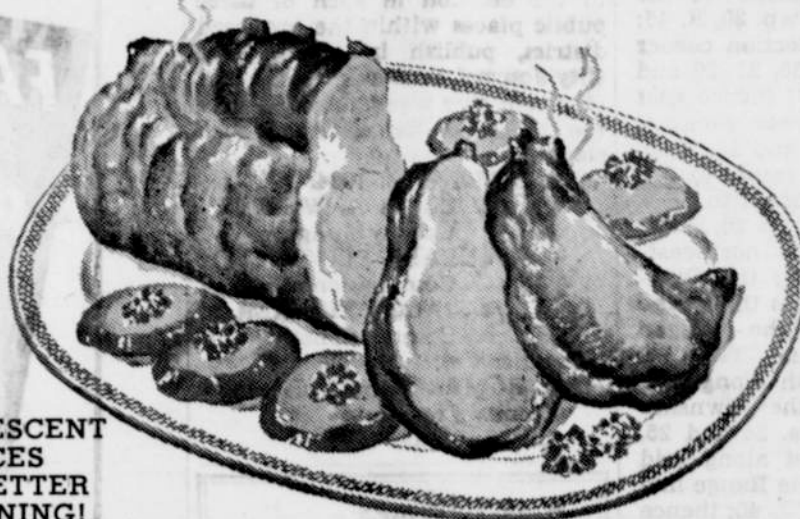

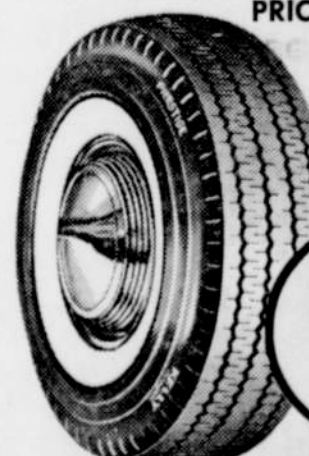
