

NHS Bulldogs to Host District 7 Track Meet

Athletes Journey for Saturday Event To Qualify for State A-2 Competition

Athletes from district 7-A2 of the Greater Oregon league will gather in Nyssa Saturday morning, May 23, to fight it out for berths in the state track meet to be held in Corvallis.

To be eligible for the state event, a contestant or team must place first or second in district competition or meet certain distance or time qualifications.

Some of the teams represented will start from home in the wee small hours of Saturday morning. Watonka high of The Dalles may have to leave home Friday afternoon as they are approximately 300 miles from Nyssa.

Heppner and Pilot Rock will have to pass through Pendleton to reach the Sugar City. Enterprise is about 65 miles beyond La Grande. Burns and John Day tracksters will have a short ride in comparison to the above-mentioned teams—and, of course, Vale will be present.

Coach Doug Wilkerson's outstanding competitors are Mike Ort in the 880 run, Ed Lawrence in the discus, Steve Kerby in the 100 and 220-yard dashes, Brent Schulthies in the high and low hurdles and broad jump.

Nyssa may pick up some points in other events. Steve Petrie, a freshman, has been placing in the shot put. Mark Stephen has run a good 880 and Mike Jefferies will be out to place in the 440. Sam Cleaver may take a place in the two-mile run, and the 880 relay team is a possible point winner.

The weather should give spectators a somewhat better break than they got on the day Nyssa entertained the Snake River Valley meet two weeks ago.
