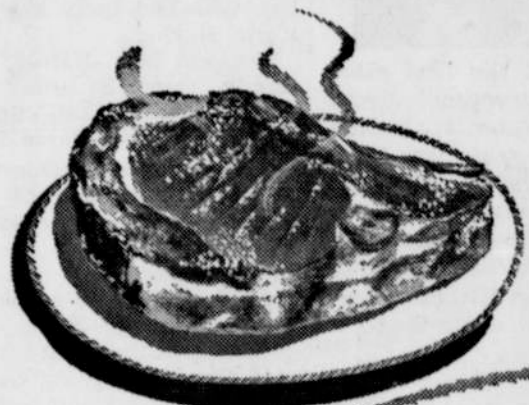
VISIT SON IN NYSSA
