Oregon Big Game Hunters Reminded Of Filing Deadlines

Big game hunters interested in obtaining permits or tags for special hunts are reminded that they must file applications before the closing dates to be eligible for the drawings.

Hunters interested in the antelope season scheduled for Aug. 22 through 26 must file applications by 5 p.m. July 22. The public drawing for antelope tags will be at 10 a.m. July 30.

Applications for management unit deer permits and controlled deer tags must be filed by 5 p.m. Aug. 5. Drawings for controlled deer tags will be 10 a.m. Aug. 12, while the drawing date for management unit permits is scheduled for 10 a.m. Aug. 14.

Elk hunters have until 5 p.m. on Sept. 3 to file applications for permit elk hunts, with the drawing date scheduled for 10 a.m. Sept. 10.

Hunters are reminded that all applications must be in the game commission's Portland headquarters by 5 p.m. on the date specified. Applications received after that date, even though they may have been mailed prior to that
