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Oregon Leadership in Water Research Reported by Oregon State President

Instead of engaging in endless controversy over conflicts of interest, the people of the United States need to bend every effort toward learning how to utilize water more effectively, President James H. Jensen of Oregon State university believes.

And, he adds, the state of Oregon could very well become the leading center of water research in the U.S. in helping to bring this about.

"We need to find means of cleaning water so that it can be used and reused again and again," President Jensen said in a recent Portland speech. "We need to develop in the minds of all men the realization that in the uses of water we share a common heritage and have common responsibilities."

Research in water resources faces frontiers of tremendous and dramatic scope, President Jensen believes. He said Oregon has already assumed a position of national leadership in water resource research and water management.

Oregon engineers and scientists are recognized throughout the country for their knowledge and their competence and federal agencies are turning to state and OSU authorities for suggestions and guidance, he explained.

"Oregon State university occupies a unique position in water research," President Jensen declared. "The concentration of an outstanding research staff, unmatched facilities and a most varied setup of resources in their natural stages gives Oregon State a substantial advantage in both depth and breadth of its water studies."

The university has 81 different studies related to water now under way, he said. These cover oceanography, stream pollution, fish and game management, watershed management, soil physics, water economics, civil engineering, crops and forests, food science and technology, among others.
