Ord Calif., where he will begin his military career with eight weeks of basic training. After completion of his mandatory training, Whitaker will enter automotive repair school, according to recruiter Sergeant First Class Joseph M. Amick of Ontario.

The recruiter further stated that Whitaker left for Ft. Ord with a written guarantee of his attendance at the army's automotive course after he completes his basic training.

This is part of the Army's "Graduate Specialist Program" and it permits qualified high school graduates, who enlist for the Regular Army, the privilege of selecting any one of the 107 technical courses available for high school graduates who can qualify. This selection and the written guarantee are all made before enlistment.
