Father of Nyssan Succumbs; Services Held at Caldwell

Requiem mass for Raymond O. Wassenhove of route 4, Caldwell, was celebrated Monday morning, Aug. 3, 1964, at St. Mary's Catholic church in Caldwell with the Rev. John Casby officiating. Rosary was recited Sunday evening at Flahiff chapel in the Idaho city.

Mr. Van Wassenhove, father of Mrs. Charles J. (Silvie) Smith of Nyssa, succumbed July 29 in Mercy hospital at Nampa after suffering a recent stroke.

He was born May 25, 1886, in Belgium and at the age of 24 years came to the United States and settled near Notus about 1910.

In 1917 he moved to the Sunny Slope community where he had since resided except for a period of five years when he lived at Garden Valley. He was united in marriage to Irma Claeys on Nov. 3, 1920, in Caldwell and had farmed all his married life. Mrs. Van Wassenhove died Oct. 16, 1957, at their home in Sunny Slope.

The deceased was a member of St. Mary's Catholic church and a charter member of the Knights of Columbus council of Nampa, Caldwell and Homedale.

In addition to Mrs. Smith, survivors include three other daughters, Mrs. Zoe Ineck of Caldwell, Miss Mary Van Wassenhove of Marsing and Mrs. Madeleine Schuler of Nampa; one son, Joseph Van Wassenhove of Marsing.

Also surviving are three brothers, Octave Van Wassenhove of Caldwell, the Rev. Paul Van Wassenhove of Haiti and Cyril Van Wassenhove of Belgium; two sisters, Sister Mary Louise of Brussels, Belgium, and Mrs. Zulma Schautet of Belgium and 33 grandchildren.
