Approximately 22 guests attended the IOOF-Rebekah picnic Sunday on the lawn at the Owen Gann home.

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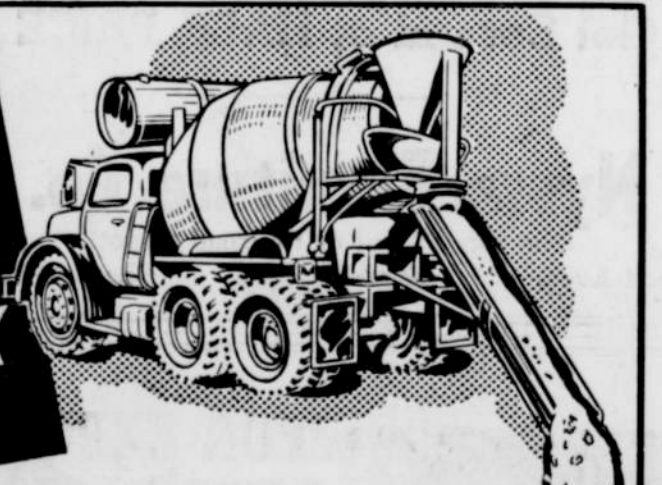
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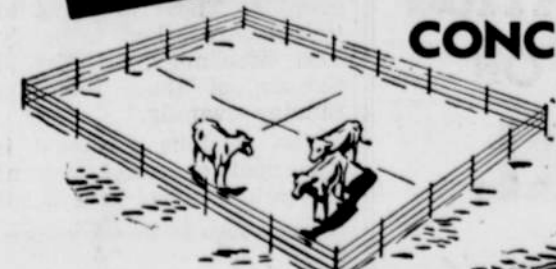
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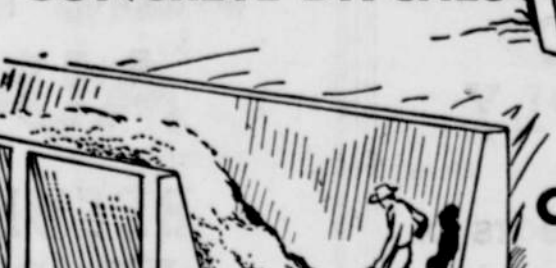
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
