### August 14 Milk Hearing May Start Battle in Courts

The State Department of Agriculture will hold a hearing Aug. 14 in Salem, the outcome of which could result in a legal battle over out-of-state milk shipments into Oregon's 33-county market pool area.

The hearing will be on the department's proposal to repeal the nine-months-old voluntary agreement on out-of-state milk shipments.

Under this agreement, Oregon handlers will be allocated equal class 1 and class 2 usage to out-of-state milk not voluntarily a part of the market.

"Cracks in the voluntary agreement have developed to the extent that we must clarify the state's authority to prevent Oregon handlers from giving out-of-state milk preferential treatment at the expense of Oregon producers," says K. W. Sawyer, chief of the stabilization program.

If the voluntary agreement should be repealed, out-of-state producers not now under pooling would be allocated quota the same as those under the pool.

This would prevent Oregon handlers from allocating more of their class 1 usage to out-of-state non-pool producers than to pool producers. At least one large handler is now allocating all of his out-of-state milk to class 1 to detriment of Oregon producers.

Sawyer said the problem has been simmering for some time. He said recent arrival of Idaho milk on the Portland market set the stage for a showdown on imported milk not participating in the Oregon market pool.

The hearing will be held in the state capitol, rooms 6 and 7, beginning at 1:30 p.m.
