Rites Held Tuesday At Episcopal Church For Walter F. Savage

Funeral services for Walter Fred Savage were conducted Tuesday afternoon, Oct. 27, 1964, at St. Paul's Episcopal church with the Rev. Armand Larive officiating. Mr. Savage succumbed Sunday morning at Malheur Memorial hospital following a brief illness. He was born Sept. 8, 1886, in Wamic, Ore., a son of William and Mattie Savage, and in June 1912 was united in marriage to Alice Procter in La Grande.

For a number of years he was affiliated with the First National Bank with branch offices at Enterprise and Pendleton. He retired from the banking business in 1948 and came to Nyssa where he became associated in business with his brother, Damon. He was a member of the Episcopal church and Masonic lodge.

In addition to his widow, Alice, and brother, Damon, both of Nyssa, he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Roberta Bleakney of Lakeview, Ore., and Mrs. Billie Laing of Lake Oswego, Ore.
