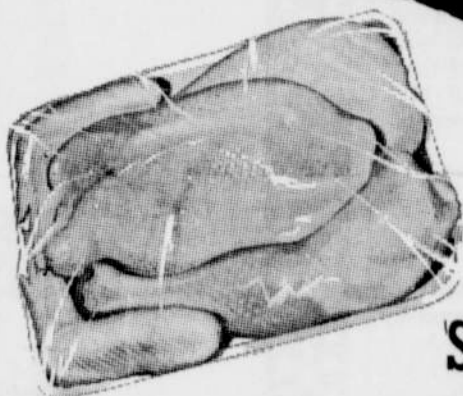
Recovers From Injuries

Ethel Goodell recently spent some time visiting with her son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Bob Goodell and family at Middleton.

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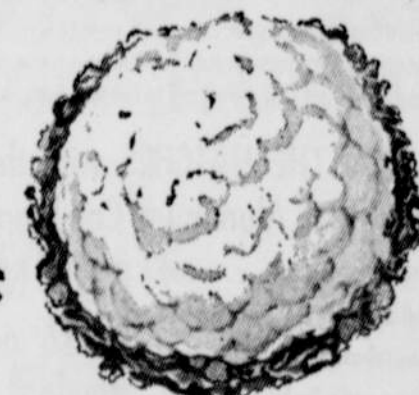
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
