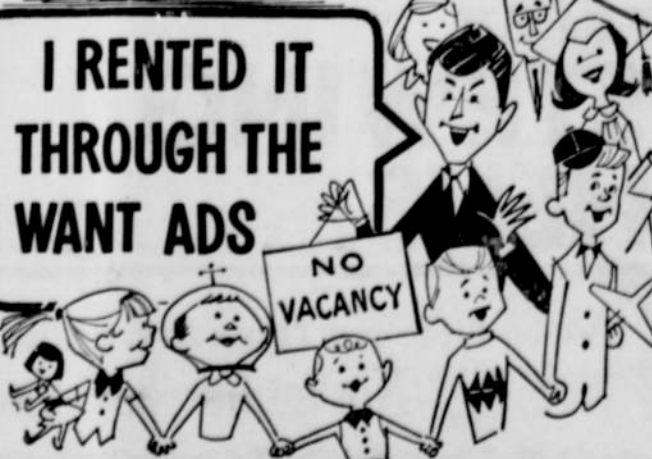
Temperature by Cricket
