Weiser managed a one-point lead at the end of the first quarter, but Nyssa took over in the second period and when the half-time buzzer sounded, led by 34-24, keeping ahead of the Wolverines during the remainder of the contest.

Cottle led the NHS lads as well as all scorers by tossing 25 counters into the hoops. Bob Bailey took honors for the Idaho squad with a total of 22 points.

The Bulldog hoopsters now have an overall season record of five wins, six losses, with a conference standing of 2-3.
