#### Extinguish Grass Fire

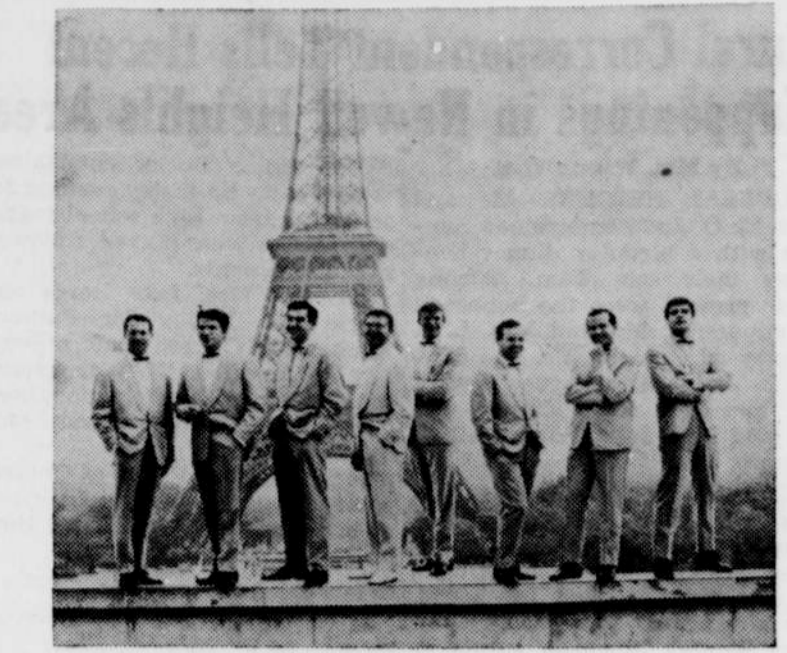
