Dog Owners Asked To Restrain Field Pets

Dog owners and dog trainers are requested by the Oregon Game commission to keep canines under tight control while training the animals in the field during the game bird nesting season. The nesting and rearing season will begin shortly and continue through August in many parts of the state. Dogs allowed to run wild can cause severe game bird nesting losses.

Although it is illegal to molest game bird nests, it is permissible to train dogs in the field throughout the year. The commission pointed out the gun dog handlers must use care to select sites where nests and young birds are not likely to be molested.
