He was born on March 29, 1902, in Oklahoma and had been a resident of Malheur county for approximately 48 years.

From about 1943 to 1945 he worked as a yardman at Owyhee dam, under Superintendent Dick Stockham. He also owned a small farm near Adrian and did some work for his neighbors.

Among survivors is a sister, Mrs. Velta Bay who resides in Boise.

Interment was made in Owyhee cemetery. Active pallbearers were Charles Weir, Leo Campbell, Cecil McCormick, Homer King, Ron Joe Smith and James Eastman.
