The airman reports that during a recent bad storm in Greenland, the wind velocity was 150 miles per hour, with temperatures at 62 degrees below zero.

From May 1963 to July 1964 Staff Sergeant Callaham was stationed at the Little Rock Air Force base in Arkansas. During that period he distinguished himself by meritorious service as noncommissioned officer in charge of the Navigational Aids Maintenance Section, 1924 Communications Squadron.
