Other first places went to the Tigers in pole vault, mile relay and mile run. Baker captured top honors in both hurdles, the 880 and mile medley relays, two-mile run, the 100- and 440-yard dashes.

Bulldog Steve Kerby won the 220-yard dash with a time of 23.0 and placed second in the 100-yard event.

Other Nyssa points were made by Maulding who placed second in the 440-yard run and also second in the 220-yard dash. Meisinger and Smit placed third and fourth, respectively, in the high jump event. The Bulldogs also placed third in the 880-yard relay and fourth in the mile medley.
