"Gideon's Trumpet" by Anthony Lewis. The author writes about events and ideas triggered by Clarence Earl Gideon, sentenced Florida state prisoner, in submitting his 1961 Supreme Court appeal claiming infringement of rights in a trial without counsel.

"Displaced Doctor" by Richard Berczeller. The memoirs of a doctor who escaped from Austria in 1938 and found himself practicing medicine in unexpected ways, in unexpected places.

"Children for Adoption" by Pearl S. Buck. Information on children all over the world available for adoption in America, the legal means of application and the "black market" operating today.

"Markings" by Dag Hammarskjold. The author's inner problems into his relation to self, man and God laid bare in the poetry and prose of diary jottings from 1925 to August 1961.

No interest will be allowed on the deposit with the bid, but the check of the successful bidder will be retained as part payment of the bonds or to secure the school district against any loss resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with terms of his bid.
