Adrian Ends Season With 9-1 Standing In B-League Contest

Adrian's final game was played Tuesday afternoon when the Antelopes defeated Parma 4-3 on the Idaho diamond. The SRV-B victory gave the Antelopes a 9-1 record in final standings.

They remain one game behind league-leading Marsing who finished the season with a 10-0 tally. Parma finished with a 5-5 mark.
