Both the principal of and the interest upon the bonds will be paid at the office of the county treasurer of Malheur County, Oregon, at Vale, Oregon.

The bonds will be sold to the highest bidder, but the district school board reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Unless all bids are rejected, the bonds will be awarded to the bidder complying with the terms of the notice of sale, and submitting the bid which provides the lowest cost to the school district.

Each bid must be unconditional, must be accompanied by a certified check or cashier's check in favor of the district, or upon a bank doing business in the state of Oregon, in the sum of \$2,700.00, and must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the undersigned and marked on the outside "Proposal for Bonds." No interest will be allowed on the deposit with the bid, but the check of the successful bidder will be retained as part payment of the bonds or to secure the school district against any loss resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with terms of his bid.

Each bidder shall include in his bid a statement of the total interest cost to the district, if his bid is accepted. The successful bidder will be furnished with the written opinion of Shuler, Sayre, Winfree & Rankin of Oregon Bank Building, Portland 4, Oregon, to the effect that the bonds constitute the valid and legally binding obligations of the said school district, which opinion shall be printed on the face of said bonds.
