

Governor Hatfield Calls Legislature To Special Session Beginning May 21

The 1965 session of the Oregon Legislature adjourned "sine die" on Friday, May 14, at 8:07 p.m. Adjournment came with a feeling of great accomplishment in many areas of government which affect directly the people in Eastern Oregon.

Many heretofore unsolved problems were tackled by the legislature and ended in the passage of progressive legislation.

A new workmen's compensation law is one example. Other accomplishments were a tax package, including a new capital gains tax law for the state of Oregon; inventory tax repeal; the passage of "head of household" legislation which would allow a widowed individual with dependents to file a joint tax return; student exemption legislation which would allow those people who had children in college, even though they made more than \$600 per year, to continue as a deduction against income tax; and most important of all, passage of a property tax relief measure.

This will provide \$25 million in direct property tax relief and

may include more should surpluses in the state continue to build.

Redistricting Unsolved

One of the knotty problems, and a disappointment to this session, was not solved, that being congressional redistricting. Because of a Supreme court decision, it became necessary for the state of Oregon to reapportion its congressional districts.

Our Eastern Oregon district, comprising 18 Eastern Oregon counties, has only 265,000 population as against the third congressional district, comprising Multnomah county, with a population of over 500,000. The court decision, in effect, demanded that congressional districts be drawn

A bipartisan plan was proposed by the House of Representatives which included Marion and Linn counties and Eastern Oregon. The plan was supported by 45 members of the House and afforded neither political advantage nor gerrymandering of districts.

Senate Rejects Proposal

The Senate rejected this bipartisan proposal and in its place supported an unacceptable plan, which was rejected almost unanimously in the House of Representatives.

Because of this impasse and because of the importance of the issue, Governor Mark Hatfield has called a special session of the legislature to convene on May 21 for the purpose of attacking again this knotty problem.

The governor will propose a compromise plan hopefully acceptable to all involved. This action will necessitate my continued stay in Salem until some agreement can be reached.

I shall continue to fight to retain for two-thirds of the state of Oregon, that being the eastern portion, representation in the congress by one who knows and understands our problems.
