

Cow Lakes Yield Excellent Catches Of Rainbow Trout

Evidently the word is out that Cow Lakes, located near the Idaho border in the Jordan Valley country, is loaded with rainbow trout, with the slab - sided fish running to good size. Larry Bisbee, game commission

that upper Cow Lake is beginning to produce excellent catches. Of 30 anglers checked recently, the catch rate was running almost six fish per angler. Of paramount interest is the size, as most rainbows are running from 10 to 14 inches in length with good numbers exceeding this mark and ranging up to 18 inches. Lesser numbers of rainbows caught ranged in the 8- to 10-inch class.

This is the lake that only two years ago supported nothing but suckers, chubs and several other miscellaneous undesirable species. Last summer the game commission chemically treated both upper and lower Cow Lakes and restocked them last fall with fingerling rainbows. Both lakes are rich in food production and by midwinter the young rainbows were pushing the 10- to 12-inch mark.




