Mrs. Milton Prowell of Baker attended Sunday services at Nyssa Christian church and visited briefly with the Wallace Prowell family.



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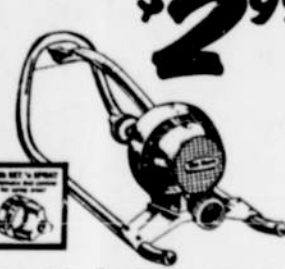
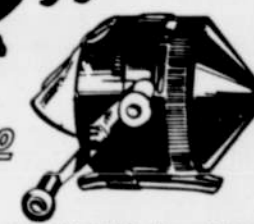
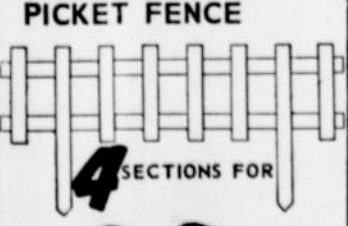
