Rites to Be Conducted At 2 O'clock Today For Isaac L. Smith

Funeral services for Isaac LeRoy Smith will be conducted at 2 o'clock this afternoon, May 27, 1965, in the Owyhee LDS chapel with Bishop Wayne Berrett officiating.

Mr. Smith succumbed Sunday at Malheur Memorial hospital where he had been a patient since the previous Wednesday when he fell, breaking a hip.

He was born Feb. 27, 1878, at Lewiston, Utah, a son of Isaac and Almira Wheeler Smith. On Jan. 22, 1902, he was united in marriage to Rosa Richardson at Richmond, Utah. They left Utah in 1919, moving to Burley, Idaho, where they remained until 1924. They then moved to northern Idaho and in August 1926 came to the Nyssa area.

Mr. Smith was a farmer, residing on Ivanhoe avenue southwest of Nyssa and was a member of the LDS church.

In addition to his widow of the home he is survived by five sons, Clifford, Kenneth, Isaac Ray and Ronald D., all of Nyssa and Thomas Ned Smith of San Jose, Calif.; a daughter, Mrs. Alma Ellis of Caldwell.

Other survivors include a sister, Mrs. Millie Harker of Cardston, Canada; 26 grandchildren and 36 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a son, Stewart Cluff who died in 1927, and a daughter Mabel Osborn who succumbed in 1961.

Interment will be made in the Owyhee cemetery under direction of Lienkaemper funeral home. Active pallbearers will be grandsons of the deceased. Honorary bearers will be Wren Hendricks, Nathaniel Ashby, Leonard Newgen, Alonzo Knowles, Mark Hartley and Reuben Haroldsen.
