The fireworks, having the appearance of small colored candy balls, sometimes marketed under the name "Cracker Balls," may easily be mistaken for candy. Children in some areas of the country have been injured when United Credit Service (Maupin), they bit into them, Dr. R. H. Wilcox, state health officer, reported.

Federal food and drug inspectors are on the lookout for these novelty items with a view toward legal action unless they are labeled to meet all requirements of the Federal Hazardous Substances Labeling act. There is a question, however, whether any labeling can be devised which would make these products free from the danger of being mistaken for candy.

Retail dealers are being asked to hold "Cracker Balls" off the market. Parents are urged to carefully observe candy and fireworks which their children obtain. Extra precaution may prevent serious injury being inflicted on children, Dr. Wilcox concluded.
