## George Mendazona Services Conducted At Catholic Church

Recitation of the Rosary, in memory of Gergorio (George) Mendazona, 71, was given last Friday evening at Lienkaemper chapel. Mass services were conducted Saturday morning at St. Bridget's Catholic church with Father Cletus M. Kirkpatrick officiating.

Mr. Mendazona succumbed on Wednesday, June 16, 1965, at Malheur Memorial hospital, after an illness of several months.

He was born Nov. 27, 1893, in Ispaster, Spain, a son of Simon and Carmen Anduiza Mendazona and attended schools in that country. He came to the United States in 1910 and had since been a resident of Malheur county, having lived in the Nyssa-Adrian-Ontario area.

Principally, he raised sheep and cattle, and at the time of his death he was residing on a farm in the Owyhee area, southwest of Nyssa. He was a member of the Catholic church.

On June 17, 1955, George and Henrietta Mendazona were united in marriage. She was the widow of his deceased brother, Hippolito, and the mother of five children, whom he later adopted.

In addition to his widow of the home, Mr. Mendazona is survived by the five adopted children, Henry Mendazona of The Dalles, Ore.; Josephine, Teresa, Victoria and Angeles, all of the home. A grandson also survives.

In addition to his brother, Hippolito, three other brothers and two sisters preceded him in death. One of the brothers and a sister were still residing in Spain.

Concluding services were conducted in St. John's cemetery at Ontario under direction of Lienkaemper funeral home.

## Chapel Rites Held For Area Pioneer, Mrs. Nora D. Ray

Funeral services for Mrs. Nora Daisy Ray, a pioneer resident of the Nyssa area, were conducted Saturday afternoon at Lienkaemper chapel. Officiating was Pastor John Milbrath of Faith Lutheran church.

Mrs. Ray succumbed at age 86 last Thursday, June 17, 1965, in Malheur Memorial hospital, following a brief illness.

She was born Feb. 18, 1879, in Grayson county, Texas, and while a very small child, moved with her parents to Missouri. In 1888 they came west by wagon train to Long Valley, Idaho, and in 1892 moved to the Nyssa community.

On July 5, 1894, she was united in marriage to John Thomas Ray who had homesteaded a farm located 2½ miles northwest of Nyssa, where they resided until his death in 1931.

Mr. and Mrs. Ray were parents of 10 children, eight of whom are still living. An infant son and a daughter, Annie May, preceded them in death. The latter succumbed at the age of six years.

Surviving daughters are Mrs. Cassie Goshert of Boise, Mrs. Dwight (Gertie) Smith, Mrs. H. A. (Elsie) Diven, Mrs. Artie (Ida) Robertson, Mrs. Elmer (Amy) Stradley and Mrs. George (Agnes) Coffman, all of Nyssa. Also surviving are two sons, John and George Ray of New Plymouth, Idaho.

Other survivors include two sisters, Mrs. Frankye Cheeley and Mrs. Georgia Whitaker, both of Boise; 19 grandchildren, 33 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.
