

Nyssa Stake Delegates Attend MIA Conference; Future Activities Told

"Love Lights the Way" was theme of the conference, during which 38 young people from the Nyssa stake participated in the dance festival, with 8,800 dancing in the "Rainbow of Tomorrow" event.

A cast of 1,000 presented a speech festival in the historic Mormon temple and 700 participants were in the roadshow demonstration entitled "Potpourri." Numerous other representatives of the Nyssa stake attended the Saturday general session and workshops for all departments of the MIA. Instructions concerning the MIA program for the coming year, within the wards and stakes, were given by general MIA board members and church authorities.

Those attending from this area report that next years activities should be outstanding, with parent-youth night, "SMC," expected to be one of the best outlined programs yet to be presented.

Boise Festival Stated

Over 100 dancers from the Nyssa stake will participate in a dance festival to be held July 5 at the Boise college stadium.
