Among other out-of-town guests attending were Mr. and Mrs. Walter Roth and Susan of Moses Lake.

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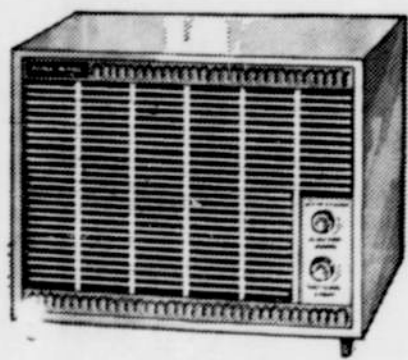
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
