NEWELL HEIGHTS—Mrs. Eugene Pratt and Mrs. Anna Pratt attended funeral services for Susie Jensen, held June 23 at the Methodist church in Vale. Mrs. Jensen was reported to be one of the oldest pioneers in this area. She came with her parents by covered wagon from Missouri in 1877 and resided on a ranch just below Bully Creek dam. Her husband died approximately four years ago. Mrs. Anna Pratt reports that she met Mrs. Jensen over 50 years ago when she and her husband were freighting. They stopped at the Jensen ranch on numerous occasions to water their six-horse team. She recalls a time when they stopped there; Mrs. Jensen was baking bread and gave them a loaf. Mrs. Pratt states that she was always doing kind things for folks in those early days of hard times.
