Masons Conduct Graveside Rites For Past Master

Funeral services for Earl Alexander, 62, were conducted Tuesday morning, June 29, 1965, at Lienkaemper chapel. Officiating minister was the Rev. Ralph A. Lawrence of Nyssa Methodist church, with musical selections by Mrs. Dwight (June Marie) Wyckoff.

Mr. Alexander succumbed at 6 o'clock Saturday evening in Malheur Memorial hospital following an illness of six years.

He was born Sept. 14, 1902, at Evansville, Ind., a son of Jesse and Emma Dewese Alexander, and was united in marriage to Myrtle Ziehm on Sept. 2, 1930, at Indianapolis. They resided in the Hoosier state until 1945 when they moved to the Nyssa area.

The deceased was an operating engineer and worked for the reclamation manager of the Ontario-Nyssa Irrigation company, and was also manager of the H and E Egg company until ill health forced his retirement.

Mr. Alexander was a member of the Methodist church and past master of Golden Rule lodge No. 147, AF & AM, Nyssa; a member of Royal Arch Masons, Zodiac chapter No. 4, Ontario, and Commandery No. 9, Knights Templar, Baker, Ore.

During World War I, he served with the U. S. Marine Corps occupational forces on Haiti.

In addition to his widow of the home on route 1, Nyssa, he is survived by two sons, Fred of Santa Barbara, Calif., Elvin Alexander of Hawthorne, Calif.; one daughter, Mrs. Sam (Pamela) Smiley of West Covina, Calif.

Also surviving are three brothers, Raymond of Madras, Ore., Eber of Boonville, Ind., and Herbert Alexander of Detroit, Mich. Five grandchildren also survive. A sister, Eva, succumbed in 1900.

Concluding services were conducted at the Nyssa cemetery by members of Golden Rule Lodge No. 147.

Active pallbearers were Charles Wernick, Paul House, William Schireman, Roy Holmes, Richard Gustavson and Robert Holmes. Honorary bearers were Frank Parr and Earl Russell.
