1965 Regulations On State Big Game Available Locally

Big game hunters are advised that copies of the 1965 big game regulations are now available at license agencies.

Regulations in booklet form were received by the commission from the printers last week and mailed to agencies as rapidly as possible. Shipments were being made by county in alphabetical order. As a result, hunters in counties such as Baker or Clatsop will be able to obtain copies a few days earlier than those in Washington or Yamhill.

The booklet is similar to those published in previous years. All seasons pertaining to each species are completely boxed in for ease in locating specific hunts. Hunters are urged to check carefully the various definitions and general regulations. Also included are unlawful hunting methods and procedures, arms and ammunition, tagging regulations, refuges open to hunting and areas closed to hunting.

The booklet also contains application deadlines and drawing dates for hunters interested in unit permits and controlled tags which are issued on a drawing basis.
